Nomination for the Scouting America National Alumnus of the Year Award



The Scouting America National Alumnus of the Year Award is Scouting Alumni's highest recognition for service to the alumni effort at the National level. The award was established to recognize alumni of Scouting America who, over a sustained period of time, have used the skills and values they learned through their association with Scouting to make significant and long-lasting contributions to their local communities through their efforts toward strengthening Scouting through the Alumni programs.

A Scouting America alumni includes anyone positively and personally impacted by Scouting America—former Scouts, family members of Scouts past and present, community leaders, and the millions of Americans who benefit from Scouting in their communities everyday.

The Alumnus of the Year features two symbols. The first is the Campfire encircled by 12 stones. This was picked as the symbol of Scouting Alumni because around a campfire, there are no strangers. A campfire calls us to gather, connects us to one another, and leads us to build and share our community. Today, a Scout campfire continues to be a place where friendships form, songs are sung, laughter is shared, and lessons are learned. Stories and skits are told and retold, as they have been by generations of America's young people.

An acorn, a symbol of Scouting America's Alumnus of the Year awards, is a reminder that tiny seeds planted along the Scouting trail will eventually cultivate and grow into extraordinary trees under which those who planted often never sit. From little acorns, mighty oaks grow.

Note: This award is not a person-of-the-year award, general lifetime achievement award, or a different version of the Silver Buffalo Award. It is to recognize significant alumni efforts at the national level.

Nomination and Selection Process

Nominations should be submitted to the Scouting Alumni committee, Awards & Recognition subcommittee. These can be submitted electronically to scouting.alumni@scouting.org. Nominations are due to the national committee by December 31st for selection and presentation at the Scouting America National Annual meeting (typically May) of the following year.

Each year the Scouting Alumni's Awards & Recognition subcommittee lead will select a selection committee chair and members. The National Selection committee will be composed of past national award recipients and those knowledgeable of the national Alumni efforts. The selection committee will consider the Alumni effort as 80% percent and the community / professional effort as 20% percent of the overall selection process.

To prevent embarrassment, the candidate should not be notified of the nomination. Self-nomination is prohibited.

Award Presentation and Recognition

The Presentation of the National Alumnus of the Year will be conducted conjunction with the Scouting America's national annual meeting unless the recipient is unable to attend the meeting. Then a suitable presentation will be arranged for the recipient with the Scouting Alumni's Awards & Recognition subcommittee lead. Presentation material will consist of a personalized certificate / Plaque, medallion, lapel pin, and knot device to affix to the Alumni Award knot (if the recipient has earned the Alumni Award).
